

Facts About Washington State University



- Began in 1890, nearly 125 years ago
- Focused on teaching, research, and service
- Ranked in Top 50 U.S. research universities
- 25,000 students statewide (20,000 in Pullman)
- Averages about 150 majors (fields of study)
- Master's and Ph.D. programs in many fields

Honors Hall: Home of the Honors College




Many Honors students live here, and take their Honors classes in the same building.

Facts about the Honors College at WSU


- One of the first in the U.S.
- Established in 1960
- Provides core curriculum classes with a global focus
- Has about 650 undergraduates total each year
- An innovator among American honors programs
- Students earn an Honors
 Certificate in addition to their Bachelor's degree
- All participate in research and make presentations

 - Academic courses with a global focus
 - Experience in another culture (study abroad)
- Exchange programs since 1962





Honors College Students' Majors* by College at WSU



- 1. Engineering & Architecture (24%)
- 2. Sciences (18%)
- 3. Liberal Arts (18%)
- 4. Agriculture & Natural Resources (includes neuroscience) (12%)
- 5. Veterinary Medicine (includes biosciences) (11%)
- 6. Business (4%)
- 7. Journalism (3%)
- 8. Pharmacy (2%)
- 9. Education (2%)
- 10. Nursing (2%)

*These percentages show what students *are* majoring in or *intend to* major in. Some students have more than one major in the same or a different college.

Facts About Chinese Students at WSU

Enrollment

- In fall 2010, WSU enrolled 551 students from China—the most from any single country.
- In 2011, that number increased to 722 students
 - Includes 411Undergraduates and 311 Graduate students
 - The most from any country other than the U.S.
 - A 450% increase over 2002 (163 from China that year)

Organizations

- Chinese Student Association. Founded in 2011 to spread Chinese culture to others.
