Application Procedures

April 1st, 2018 is the application deadline for the academic year 2018-19.

1. Fill out and sign the International Guest Student Application.
(See separate attachment)
2. Submit one letter of recommendation from your home university or from your sponsor organization recommending you for study at the College of Engineering and Computer Science of the University of Michigan–Dearborn.
3. Submit an English translation of your official transcript from your home university.

*Students applying to a MS or MSE program must provide TOEFL score of at least 84, IELTS score of 6.5, or MELAB score of 80 or above.

4. Submit Verification of English Language Proficiency form
(Section C – page 7)
5. Fill out and sign the Study Plan form
(Section D – page 8)

Students will be notified of their admission by the Office of Admissions & Orientation.

This application is only valid for students NOT completing an undergraduate degree prior to September 2018.

A. Affidavit of Financial Resources

- Submit an original bank certification (in English) from your financial supporter, converted to U.S. dollars with minimum amount of \$16,500 per semester (\$33,000 for two semesters) to cover tuition, living expenses, books, supplies, and health insurance.
- If the financial certification is not in the student's name, submit a certified letter (in English) from the student's financial supporter stating that the funds indicated on the bank certification will be used to support the student's fees and living expenses while attending UM-Dearborn. The letter has to show the original signature of the financial supporter.

Notes:

- International students must demonstrate full financial support before a UM-Dearborn I-20/DS-2019 form can be issued.
- Scholarship: The full time costs for academic year 2018-2019 are estimated as \$33,000 per academic year (two semesters): \$18,500 for tuition and fees; \$11,400 for living expenses; \$3,100 for books, supplies, and health insurance. (Without the scholarship, costs are estimated as \$44,000 per year). This is based on 12 credit hours per semester.
