


# **Application Guide for Exchange Students**

- 11. After you have submitted your application, you can log back in after 24 hours to upload any additional documents you need to complete your application:
- **Nomination by home university**: Please ignore this. Our Study Abroad Team will confirm this with your home university.
- <u>Academic transcript</u>: Upload a copy of your official or unofficial academic transcript in English, or your application will not be assessed. This document does not need to be certified, but must contain your name and the name of your home university.

- English proficiency: Students for whom English is not their first language are required to provide evidence of English proficiency. We accept a number of English language test results including IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, MELAB, Pearsons and other alternatives. Please visit our website for details:
   www.auckland.ac.nz/is-english. On pages 7-9, you can find a list of alternative proofs of English proficiency for Exchange students from some countries.
- <u>COPOS COPEX requirements</u>: This is to upload a certified copy of your birth certificate or passport. To be recognised as a certified copy, it needs to be signed and stamped by a staff member from your exchange office, or notarised.
   Alternatively, your home university can email a copy to our Study Abroad office directly at <u>studyabroad@auckland.ac.nz</u>.

## Evidence of English Proficiency for Study Abroad and Exchange Students

Please find a summarised list below of the evidence of English proficiency that is accepted by the University of Auckland for our study abroad and exchange programmes. The full list of English language requirements can be viewed online <u>here</u>. If you're uncertain what type of evidence you need to provide with your application, please email <u>studyabroad@auckland.ac.nz</u> for help. New Zealand and Australian passport holders are considered domestic students and are therefore not required to provide evidence of English language proficiency with their applications.

### 1. International Students from Majority English Speaking Countries

Passport holders of the countries listed below will be deemed to have satisfied English language proficiency requirements if they have completed a senior secondary school qualification with successful study in an English-intensive subject<sup>1</sup>, or successful tertiary study in the English medium:

- Canada
- Ireland
- Singapore
- United Kingdom
- United States of America

All test results are valid for two years from the date on the test certificate to UoA programme commencement. The requirements must be met within one test certificate.
